DIRECTIONS FROM THE EAST

- Take M4 J32 onto the A470 sign-posted Merthyr Tydfil.
- Go through four roundabouts and take the next roundabout first exit onto the Heads of the Valleys Road A465.
- Enter next roundabout and take second exit to A465.
- Enter next roundabout and take third exit onto A4059 sign-posted Cwmtillery.
- The Lakes are two miles on the right-hand side in the centre of Cwmtillery.
- Estimated journey time of 25 minutes
- Estimated distance 25 miles.
